

## Preview for Final Examination

The basic format of the final examination will be the same as it was for the first two exams. Thus there will be a take-home portion due on the day of the exam at 11.59 PM and an in-class portion, in this case consisting of up to 100 multiple-choice questions. Thus on exam day you should bring with you 1) one Scantron™ form, and 2) a #2 pencil. Your essay must be submitted by 11.59 PM that same day. *Late examinations will be neither administered nor accepted.*

As before, the exam will be based on the materials for the course, and it therefore does not make sense for you to consult outside sources, as these will be more likely to complicate your exam.

As concerns content, the exam will be cumulative but will focus the bulk of its attention on the last unit of the course. This means that you should review the main lines of our inquiry into the United States and Russia, while also preparing to answer questions on Iran. Although it is difficult to produce a definitive list for the entire exam, in general you would be well served to be reasonably familiar with the following terms, concepts, people, institutions, publications, and places:
