**Excellent Triads for Fun & Edification**

The first triad would of course draw heavily on Niamark, while also perhaps invoking Judt on the issue of postwar retributions more generally. The second involved the appropriate chapter in Judt primarily, though other evidence might also be brought to bear (e.g., Kovaly's memoir). The third – on economics – is designed to contemplate the reasons for Europe's postwar affluence (at least after the first few years of reconstruction) and the role of planning in that process. Finally, the one on Czechoslovakia would draw most heavily on Kovaly's memoir, while also using the material from Judt to elucidate the larger context.
